### Introduction

The Eighth All India School Education Survey is being conducted throughout the country. In this survey, data are being collected from each and every village, city/town and school to assess the status of educational facilities and their utilization. In order to establish accuracy and reliability of data, Post- Enumeration School Information Form (PESIF) has been designed.

### Post-Enumeration School Information Form (PESIF)

This form seeks information from selected schools for checking accuracy and reliability of some important data items for which information has already been collected. All information asked in the schedule to be provided as on **30<sup>th</sup> September 2009** unless it is specified otherwise.

The enumerator will collect the information from the school records with the help of Principal/Head master. Extra care is to be taken personally by the enumerator for collecting the information correctly.

### How to Answer

- (a) Please fill in each item of this form carefully to ensure accuracy and completeness.
- (b) Please use the **international numerals** while supplying the information in numbers.
- (c) Please write name in **English Capital Letters** to facilitate computerisation. The information collected from the school will be computerised. Take extra care to read the procedure of supplying the information that is printed in *Italics* along with the items.
- (d) Most of the items have been provided with two or more alternative responses. Each alternative has been provided with a code. The number within the brackets is the code for that response. In addition, a blank box is provided in the right margin for writing the response code. **Writing of response code in the box is essential.** In such items, only one alternative is applicable to your school situation. **Please put a code of the applicable response in the box provided in the right margin.**

## **Definitions and Explanation**

### **1. School Category**

*School category will be determined **as per state pattern** on the basis of the highest class in a school.*

*For example, in a state where classes I-V, VI-VIII, IX-X and XI- XII form primary, upper primary, secondary and higher secondary stages respectively, the category of the school will be decided as follows:*

*A school having classes up to V will be termed as **Primary school**.*

*A school having highest class either VI, VII or VIII will be termed as **Upper Primary school**.*

*A school having highest class either IX or X will be termed as **Secondary school**.*

*A school having highest class either XI or XII will be termed as **Higher Secondary school**.*

### **2. Management of School**

**Government :** *A Government School is that which is run by the State Government or Central Government or Public Sector Undertaking or an Autonomous Organisation completely financed by the Government.*

**Local Body :** *A Local Body School is that which is run by Panchayati Raj or Local Body institutions such as Zilla Parishad, Municipal Corporation, Municipal Committee, Notified Area Committee, and Cantonment Board.*

**Private Aided :** *A Private Aided School is that which is run by an individual or a private organisation and receives grant from Government or Local Body.*

**Private Unaided :** *A Private Unaided School is that which is managed by an individual or a private organisation and does not receive any grant either from Government or Local Body.*

### **3. Type of School**

**Boys' School :** *Boys' school is that in which boys are admitted to all classes and admission of girls is restricted to some specific classes.*

**Girls' School :** *Girls' school is that in which girls are admitted to all classes and admission of boys is restricted to some specific classes.*

**Co-educational School :** *Co-educational school is that in which both boys and girls are admitted to all classes in the school.*

### **4. Para-teachers**

*Para teachers are those teachers who have been appointed in primary and upper primary schools either on contract and/or on terms and conditions different from the regular teachers cadre.*

*A few examples of a Para Teachers are Vidya Volunteers in Andhra Pradesh, Nagar Shikshak/Panchayat Shikshak/Prakhand Shikshak in Bihar, Rehbar-E-Taleem/Contract Teacher/Third teacher/Substitute to Zonal Resource Person in J&K, Samvida Shikshak in M.P., Shiksha Sevak in Maharashtra, Shiksha Sahayak in Orissa, Shiksha Sahayogi in Rajasthan, Shiksha Mitra in U.P., Utrakhand Shikshakarmis, Chahattisgarh, Additional Para-Teacher, Lady Para-Teacher, Para Physical Teacher (Jharkhand), etc.*

**8. School Building**

**Pucca Building:** A school building is to be treated as pucca if it has its walls and roof made of the following materials.

**Wall Material:** Burnt bricks, stones (duly packed with lime or cement), cement concrete or timber, plywood, bamboo, artificial wood of synthetic material and PVC.

**Roof Material:** Tiles, G.I./metal/asbestos sheets, concrete, bricks, stones, timber, bamboo, plywood, artificial wood of synthetic material and PVC.

**Partly Pucca Building:** A school building is to be treated as partly pucca if it has its walls made of the above mentioned material but roof is made of the materials other than those mentioned above such as bamboos, grass, thatch, etc..

**Kuchcha Building:** School building, the walls and/or roof of which are made of materials other than those mentioned above such as unburnt bricks, bamboos, mud, grass, reeds, thatch, loosely packed stones is to be treated as kuchcha building.
